Once again it has been a wet year in Alberta, across pretty much the entire province according to the news channels. The difference from last year is that **we are getting much needed sunshine as well as some heat during the day!** Last year, most days were cloudy or rainy, this year the storms tend to start almost daily in late afternoon and evening allowing us some sun during the work day. For lily gardeners, these conditions certainly allow you to evaluate which varieties are resistant to botrytis, for it is easy to spot those that are without brown foliage and looking healthy despite the presence of this fungal disease.

Once again in our gardens, it is the **Fellner lilies that stand out in this wet year**, standing tall (or short, as in the case of our 2011 introduction) healthy and lush with green foliage and hardly a spot of brown to be found until late in the season. You will find a number of Fellner lilies to choose from within our catalog this fall, all of them worth growing in your garden. If you **visit our web catalog** you will be able to easily pick from them as we have a category just for them.

Our 2011 lily introduction (featured on the cover) is one of those outstanding Fellner hybrids, first planted here in 2001. It has persisted and increased on its own very readily each year. **It is a great choice for the mid section of the perennial bed, where you don't want something too tall or too short**, with blooming starting in mid July.

Good news for us last week, we were told our daughter's Leukemia treatment will end in October/November this year! Hopefully this will allow us to resume business and bring it back to the standards we established previously. I have to admit it has been a struggle to maintain it these past 2 years and it seemed to be worse this year than the year before - one of the reasons your catalog is so late to arrive! ASIATIC LILIES

BLACK SPIDER™ \$5.00 ea or 3/\$13.50

Green throat leads to black-red tango spreckles which fade to pale yellow petals. A striking lily with a good bud count. Grows to 1M tall, blooming in mid July. (1a)

BRONZE MEDAL \$7.00 ea or 3/\$18.00

Obviously a tetraploid with its large leaves and huge flowers and vigour, this one will make passers-by stop for a second look! Reddish-pink outer edges and center with a vivid yellow in the middle. Grows to 1M tall, blooming early to mid July. (1a)

CALGARY TOWER \$6.00 ea or 3/\$15.75 


Vivid reddish orange with a strong red throat and dark maroon spotting. Grows 1.2M tall, blooms mid July. (1b) *Photo back cover*

CHOPIN \$5.00 ea or 3/\$13.50

Baby pink petals with an ivory throat, faint red spotting in the center. Grows 1 to 1.2M tall, blooming mid July. (1a)

CRIMSON PIXIE™ \$4.00 ea or 3/\$10.50

A short red lily, ideal for borders and pots. Produces large, unspotted vivid red flowers making a dramatic impact early in summer. Blooms late June to early July on 30 to 60 cm stems. (1a)

DIAMOND WILLOUGH \$15.00 ea or 3/\$42.00 

Rich ruby red coloring with a generous sprinkling of dark spots and a flash of yellow in the center of each petal make a stunning combination. Botrytis resistant, fade proof in the highest heat - not only an excellent garden performer but a winning show stem specimen as well, bred right here in Alberta. Grows 1.1M tall, blooms mid to late July. (1a/b) *Photo back cover*

DONNA SYLVESTER \$4.50 ea or 3/\$12.00 

Large downfacing flowers, bright yellow with dark spotting. Stems reach 60 - 100 cm tall, blooming in mid July. (1c)

ASIATIC LILIES

DOT COM™ \$5.00 ea or 3/\$13.50


Candy pink petals with brilliant red speckling in the center. Grows 1M tall, blooming mid July. Although it attracts a lot of attention in the garden this lily was bred for the cutflower trade and thus not the best garden performer. In our gardens, it appears to be a botrytis magnet but it does multiply well.

ELODIE \$6.00 ea or 3/\$15.75

Candy pink with a greenish yellow throat and red spotting. Flowers are double and sterile, born on sturdy stems reaching 1.4M tall. Blooms in early to mid July. (1a/b)

FANCY NANCY \$15.00 ea **EXCLUSIVE** 

Our 2009 Introduction - what an incredible lily it is, especially considering it was a rogue seedling mixed up with another! It does not propagate the fastest, and it takes a few years to get established, but when it does - you might be looking up! Dark stems so thick I must use an axe to chop them down in Fall, grow 1.2 M tall typically, but once established a couple years (and even under drought conditions when everything else is shorter than normal) it has hit 1.8 M tall, the equivalent of 6 feet. A magnificent amount of flowers in pale yellow with purple dashes and spots enhanced by a small brush of deeper yellow in the center of the petals. Flowers are large and although the stem appears well spaced before opening, they appear crowded after doing so as flowers are large. This my gardening friends, is the closest to a 'tree lily' you will find for the cold zones and requires no extra protection! Blooms late July to early August with secondary buds. (1a)


HEATHER'S PROMISE \$13.50 ea **EXCLUSIVE** 

Stunning stems of fuzzy buds open to white flowers with a deep pink blush, raised papillae and loads of purple spotting. Dark, mottled stems are very sturdy with the deepest green foliage, growing to 1.2M. Raceme inflorescence is a show winner, too bad it blooms in late July or early August when all the shows are finished! (1a)

HIAWATHA \$6.00 ea or 3/\$15.75

Bred by US breeder Louise Koehler who is known for releasing excellent garden lilies. Hiawatha is tall, growing to 1.2 M and blooms late July to early August in our zone 3 garden. Large, side-facing cherry red flowers with loads of fine spots. Vigorous, excellent garden lily which is exactly what it was bred to be! (1b)


ASIATIC LILIES

HONEY PINK \$5.00 ea or 3/\$13.50 

Big, delicate looking pale pink flowers with a white stripe in the center of each petal, and faint spotting. Grows to 60 cm tall, suitable for potting or borders. Blooms mid July. (1b)

JASPER \$7.00 ea or 3/\$18.00 


Pink-tan flowers, a dependable old lily growing 60 - 100 cm tall, blooming in late July. Introduced in 1940. (1c)

LINDA MAY \$5.00 ea or 3/\$13.50 


Very similar to 'Melissa Jamie', but this one is spotted heavily. Stems grow to .6M tall, producing large flowers of creamy yellow with peachy-pink tips. Blooms in mid July. (1b-c)

LORETO \$4.50 ea or 3/\$12.00

A bold, dark yellowish orange, large flower with a burgundy flame in the petal. Grows 1M tall, blooming in early July. (1a)

MELISSA JAMIE \$4.50 ea or 3/\$12.00 


Soft pink tips with a creamy lemon center and a few spots. Grows only 60 cm tall, making an excellent show in pots or in the border. Blooms mid July. (1b/c) *Photo back cover*

MRS. BRIGHT \$15.00 ea or 3/\$42.00 **EXCLUSIVE** 

Small white flowers of a very thick substance with contrasting burgundy spots and a frosted throat. We have counted 20 + fuzzy buds on the tall stems which have reached 1.4M in great conditions. Deep green foliage enhances the pristine flower color. Blooms early to mid July, stems average 1.2M. (1a) *Photo back cover*


MUSIC ART™ \$5.00 ea or 3/\$13.50

Graceful flower shape and consistency in the tango pattern. Bright yellow with red speckling. Grows 1M tall, blooming mid to late July. (1a)


NIGHT FLYER \$6.00 ea or 3/\$15.75 

Deep, deep black-red is still the latest craze in all things plants. This is a taller lily suitable for the back of the border as it grows to 1.75M tall - but will average 1.4M. High bud count, blooms in mid to late July. (1b-c) *Photo back cover*


ASIATIC LILIES

PINK CHAMPAGNE \$5.00 ea or 3/\$13.50 


Tall, growing to 1 to 1.2M, blooming late, usually starting in early August with bronze-pink flowers that are heavily spotted almost to the tips. (Ib)

PLANTERS PINK \$6.00 ea or 3/\$15.75 **EXCLUSIVE** 


Sailor sky-pink and cream petals, darker pink edges and unspotted. Very vivid colors when blooming under cool conditions, fades a little quicker in the heat. Grows to 1.1M tall, blooms early to mid July for us on the Prairies. Botrytis resistant with many buds per stem, multiplies very well. Although not Show stem quality as many of Mr. Fellner's hybrids tend to be, this one has been very popular with our visitors over the years, prompting me to release it as a great garden lily. (Ia)

PORT ALBERNI TIGER \$5.00 ea or 3/\$13.50 

Just like the orange tiger lily, but much, much taller with larger flowers, larger spots and a later bloom period. It can hit 2M tall in a good year! Blooms anywhere from late July to September. (Ic)

RED BLAZE \$5.00 ea or 3/\$13.50 

Large pinkish-red flowers with a blaze of yellow in the center. The 'blaze' becomes bigger when blooming under warm temperatures. Some spotting, blooms July on 1.2M stems. (Ib)

RED GALAXY \$5.00 ea or 3/\$13.50 

Large red flowers with a straw-colored center, giving it a star appearance. Lots of dark spots on flowers growing to 1M tall. Blooms July. (Ib-c)

RED VELVET \$6.00 ea or 3/\$15.75

Velvety black-red flowers are out-facing on strong stems, it is a triploid. Frequently a show winner, listed in the NALS Lily Hall of Fame, blooms in late July to early August on 1.4M tall stems. Disease resistant and very hardy. (Ib)

ROBINSONS COMET \$7.00 ea or 3/\$18.00 

A creamy magenta throat compliments the deep pink petals, which have a small orangey spot in the center. Heavily spotted, growing to 1.4M tall, blooming in early August. Tiger lilies in the parentage make for high production of stem bulbils. Also known as Comet I. (Ib/c)


ASIATIC LILIES

SADIE \$6.00 ea or 3/\$15.75

Upfacing pink with a yellow center. Unspotted, grows to 1M tall and blooms mid July for quite a long period. (1c)

SOLAR RAY \$6.00 ea or 3/\$15.75

Huge, bright yellow flowers are downfacing. Deeper yellow ray down the center and freckled with an occasional spot. Tetraploid, growing 1 M tall. (1b)

STRIPTease \$7.00 ea or 3/\$18.00 **EXCLUSIVE** 

Another fantastic Fellner hybrid bred in Alberta. 1.2M dark stems with a plethora of buds forming atop. Big, deep wine red flowers with a frosted white throat leading to deeper red, followed by dark spotting with the petals fading at the tips to lighter red and a strip of bright white down the centre. Show stem quality, but alas, it blooms late - typically the last of July or first of August. (1a) *Photo back cover*

SWEET KISS \$4.50 ea or 3/\$12.00

Deep peachy pink with an orange glow, lightly spotted, pollen is sterile. Grows to 1.2M tall. Even though it does not have a high bud count, it is too pretty and sturdy not to grow in the garden. I suspect it may be a tetraploid or polyploid since it is so vigorous! (1a)

TIGER BABIES \$6.00 ea or 3/\$15.75

Lightly scented, large pastel peach flowers with deep peach throats. Blooms late June, early July on 1 to 1.2M stems. Another one of those best-of-the-best garden lilies that you just can't fail with. (1c)

TIGRINUM FLORE PLENO \$5.00 ea or 3/\$13.50

A mutated form of the species named in 1870, with double flowers and no stamens. Produces hairy stems and buds, growing to 1.2M tall. Flowers are orange with lots of spotting. Blooms late July to mid August around here. Hardy as nails, drought tolerant too.

TINY ATHLETE™ \$5.00 ea or 3/\$13.50

This variety grows 33 cm tall, blooming 5 days ahead of the rest in the Series, with delicate pink flowers and dark pollen for contrast. One of the best growers in the series, reliable and compact. Blooms mid June to early July. (1a)

ASIATIC LILIES

TINY HOPE™ \$5.00 ea or 3/\$13.50

Bud count on this variety is both hearty and plentiful, with an extended bloom period of more than 2 weeks. Real red with a deeper shade of red in the center. One of the tallest in the Series, also taking about a week or two longer to bloom. Grows to 40 cm tall, blooms late June to early July. (Ia)

TINY PADHYE™ \$5.00 ea or 3/\$13.50

Grows 40 cm tall, blooming late June to early July with many white flowers overlaid with a blotch of purple in the center. (Ia)

TINY PUPPET™ \$5.00 ea or 3/\$13.50

Deep blood red coloring, somewhere in between that found in 'Tiny Ghost' & 'Tiny Hope'. Grows 55 cm tall, one of the tallest in the Series and blooms early July. Drought tolerant. (Ia)

TINY SENSATION™ \$5.00 ea or 3/\$13.50

Bright yellow with maroon speckling really catches everyone's attention. Very compact and quick to grow, this variety grows 35 cm tall and blooms in mid June to early July. It appears to be a little thirstier than the others though, keep that in mind when planning where to plant. (Ia)

TINY TODD™ \$5.00 ea or 3/\$13.50

Blooms with soft pink petals accented by white centers and produces a significant amount of above-average sized blooms. Exceptional bloom period, close to two weeks even in high heat. Also drought tolerant. Blooming in 60 days from sprouting, your flower bed will not be complete without this exciting hybrid! Grows .38M tall, blooming in mid June to early July. (Ia)

TROPICAL BREEZE \$6.00 ea or 3/\$15.75

Unique & unusual, with creamy white to pale pink petals overlaid with the ever-popular red tango pattern. A hint of yellow in the petals often found under cool growing and blooming temperatures, colors are varied depending on temperatures and so is the tango pattern. Grows to .7M tall with loads of flowers. An excellent garden variety. Deep green foliage, blooming mid July. (Ia)

ORANGE MARMALADE \$25.00 ea

Dark orange flowers are pollenless and unspotted, stems grow 1.2 to 1.5 M tall and are black, with some green mottling and 24-32 flowers on each one. Blooms early July. Also known as *Tsinson*. (IIb)

ROSALINDA \$30.00 ea

Attractive blooms that are shell pink on the tips but creamy white and yellow within the inner third, freckles of deep red accent the inner area; impressive when massed in an area or as a border planting, best in partial shade. Stems grow to 1.2 M, blooming in late June. (IIc)

SARCEE \$35.00 ea

Flowers are well spaced, deep burgundy with tips almost black, unspotted with strong orange pollen. Stems grow to 1.2m, dark green, blooming in June. (IIc)

SWEET BETSY \$35.00 ea

Cream overlaid with pink and deep pink midribs, very few maroon spots and golden colored pollen. Plum colored stems grow to 1.7 M tall, blooms in early July. (IIc)

SOME NOTES

Wondering about the martagon listings, when I have told so many of you I will never grow them for sale? Actually, I am not growing them..... they come from a dear friend who must reduce her collection and time spent in the garden. She has a wonderful collection of named martagons and is also breeding her own for the future! I feel very fortunate that she wishes me to sell them for her, it allows me to provide a more diverse selection of lilies encompassing yet another class of lilies to my customers, and I know they are all true to name and have been verified by more than one martagon expert. Although it is not a long list, they are choice lily varieties and we can expect to have more for next year as well!

A note about Botrytis - be sure to do a good garden clean-up during and after the garden season is over. Botrytis attacks more than just lilies so you want to be sure to remove all dead foliage from ALL plants this fall! Also, it can help to spray Copper Sulphate (bluestone) over the soil surfaces after clean-up is complete. Mix it at a rate of 1 tsp powder to 1 Litre of water. Copper is a great fungicide and kills spores on contact.

A gem we've had growing and blooming here since 2001, *Short Stop* will be a welcome addition to the perennial bed fitting somewhere in the middle with a height of 60-80 cm. Blooming starts mid July to end of July on dark green, sturdy stems with average 10-12 buds. Flower size is small but with great substance - thick petals of white, with contrasting orange pollen and brilliant burgundy smattering of spots over a light brush of cream yellow, circling the greenish-yellow frosted throat. LA HYBRID LILIES

ALADDIN'S DAZZLE \$4.50 ea or 3/\$12.00

Dazzling yellow flowers growing on 1-1.2M stems blooming in July. Also known as Ceb Dazzle. (VIIIa)

JAZZ IT UP \$6.00 ea or 3/\$15.75

Hot pink with a white throat and deeper pink spotting on large, perfectly formed flowers. Grows 1.15 M tall, blooming mid July. (VIIIa/b)

KENTUCKY \$6.00 ea or 3/\$15.75

Large melon flowers are speckled heavily with burgundy and attract lots of attention with our Open Garden visitors. Stems grow to 1.2M tall, blooming mid July. Loads of flowers, stems produce secondary buds. Simply outstanding, gets better every year! (VIIIa-b)

LITOUWEN \$6.00 ea or 3/\$15.75

Vivid green throat and dark pollen shows nice contrast on this large flowered, wide petaled, pure white hybrid. Very large flowers on stems that grow to 1M tall, blooms mid July. (VIIIb)

ROYAL TRINITY \$5.00 or 3/\$13.50

A tall and vigorous lily with a number of upfacing vivid, glowing orange flowers. One of the better LA's for the garden, it grows to 1.1 M tall and blooms late July. (VIIIa)

SUNCREST \$4.50 ea or 3/\$12.00

Pale yellow flowers with a smattering of dark red speckling scattered throughout. Large flowers on 1.35 M stems, blooming mid July. (VIIIa/b)

TAMBURO \$5.00 ea or 3/\$13.50

A unique color, reminiscent of a watermelon perhaps? Whether you consider it red or pink, it is certainly unique and the faint white center with the equally faint spots are all in harmony. Grows 1M tall, blooms late July to early August. (VIIIa)

TROPIC DIAMOND \$5.00 ea or 3/\$13.50

Watermelon red, with a yellow-green throat and no spots. Just like Party Diamond, the chalice shaped flowers are bred for cutting but make great garden lilies too. Light fragrance is never overpowering in the house. Grows to 1M tall, blooming early to mid July. (VIIIa/b)

OA HYBRID LILIES

These are relatively new in lily breeding, tender orientals crossed with hardy asiatics. As we planted our first of these in the Fall of 2006, we are now able to give a true evaluation of their hardiness and performance in the garden. At present, we can tell you they overwinter without extra protection and although they come up late in spring, each one comes up and blooms profusely, even those of small bulb size.

If you are in Zones 1 to 2, and if you have not planted these previously we suggest mulching them for winter, planting deeply and only in spring to help ensure they overwinter in your garden the first year. They are hardy for all other zones.



ELEGANT CROWN \$8.00 ea or 3/\$21.00
Deep rose unspotted petals outlined in cream with a creamy, frosted throat. Fade resistant in high heat, disease resistant as well. Strong stems, large flowers, vivid colors - a prime candidate for the focal point in your perennial bed. Blooms late July or early August. Produces many flowers on strong, 1 M tall stems. Fragrant & hardy, rare for lilies! (Villa)



FIRST CROWN \$8.00 ea or 3/\$21.00
Aptly named, this is the first in the Crown Series of OA lilies to bloom, in unique tropical shades of peach with subtle spotting. Gentle fragrance on large flowers. Grows 1.1 M tall, blooming late July to early August. (Villa-b/b)

ORIENPET (OT) HYBRID LILIES

BAYWATCH \$8.00 ea or 3/\$21.00

Nice bright pink petals with a yellow/green throat. What makes it unique is its ability to flower 1-2 weeks sooner than most other OT's. Grows 1.3 M tall, blooming mid July to mid August. (VIIIa)

HOLLAND BEAUTY \$9.00 ea or 3/\$24.00

Pinkish red with thin yellow margins, ruffled petal edges on such large flowers are quite a conversation piece, and it blooms just a few days sooner than most OT's. If you choose just one Orienpet lily to try, this must be it! Grows 1 M tall, blooming late July to mid August. (VIIIb-c)

MAYWOOD \$8.00 ea or 3/\$21.00

Bright pink, upfacing petals with a green throat edged in yellow. Grows 1.1M tall, blooming mid July to late August. (VIIIa)

NORTHERN DELIGHT \$9.00 ea or 3/\$24.00

Strong, large golden yellow flowers are unspotted & fragrant. Similar to *Golden Stargazer* but hardier with larger flowers and unruffled petal edges. Grows 1.2M tall, blooms late July to mid August. (VIIIb)

NYMPH \$9.00 ea or 3/\$24.00

Unique color combo of yellow with red brushes. This grows very strong stems and lasts a bit longer than most in bloom. Great fragrance! Excellent for cutting, be prepared for the yellow to fade to white in high heat. Grows 1.1M tall, blooms in late July to early August. (VIIIa)

PURPLE KING \$9.00 ea or 3/\$24.00

Bright pink with deeper, vivid pinkish-purple overlays that accent the deep green throat. Unspotted, sidefacing erect blooms are well spaced, a great quality desired for entering stems in lily and garden shows. A King indeed! Grows to 1.1 M tall, blooming mid July to early August. (VIIIb)

ROBINA \$8.00 ea or 3/\$21.00

Big, bright neon pink blooms sport a small white throat for contrast. Colorfast in high heat, with deep green foliage and notably strong stems. Big, bold and in your face best describes this lily! Grows 1.3M tall apparently, but never past .9M for us. Blooms mid July to early August. (VIIIa)

URANDI \$9.00 ea or 3/\$24.00

20 to 25 cm blooms of icy pink with a yellow flame. Pink fades to white in hot weather. Nicely scented flowers with an excellent vase life, ideal plant for your cutting garden. Stems grow 1.2 to 1.4M tall, blooms late July to early August. (VIIIa)

YELLOWEEN \$8.00 ea or 3/\$21.00

Grows 1.2 M tall, blooms late July or early August. Clear unspotted yellow, large upright trumpet shaped blooms, robust growth and fragrance made in heaven. Stunning beside blue delphiniums! (VIIIa/b)

We replace spoiled bulbs upon their immediate return (within 10 days). It is your responsibility to inspect all bulbs upon arrival and notify us of any problems. It is also your responsibility to plant them immediately.

Shipping Information

We ship Canada Post Expedited within CA. To USA we use Expedited or XpressPost whichever method your paid shipping cost will cover. Most orders overseas are shipped via XpressPost International, Canada Post no longer offers any other option in most cases.
